URGENTLY NEEDED: Soccer Director(s)

Delwood is without a soccer director as of June 2019. We hope that a Soccer Director can be found as soon as possible so we can prepare for the outdoor season. Previously, we have had two directors to share the work and would support that again.

Soccer Director(s) Duties

- Report to Delwood's Sports director.
- Set registration dates and conduct registrations in the late winter and late summer for the outdoor and indoor seasons.
- Collect registration fees and supply deposits to Delwood's Treasurer.
- Assist where needed, helping parents with special funding programs.
- Build teams for certain age categories U5-U19. Find coaches/managers for the teams - usually for the younger teams.
- Create and manage teams on the soccer association's website portal for Delwood.
- Transfer players in and out of Delwood as required.
- Ensure the current inventory of jerseys and shorts are in good condition. Maintain the inventory of equipment which is supplied to each coach.
- Arrange for team pictures/trophies/socks for teams.
- Attend planning sessions for the soccer association held in mid-winter. Possibly attend required directors meetings called by the soccer association.

Delwood's executive aid in assisting with the registration process each season. The former soccer director(s) are willing to mentor the new director(s) to aid with learning the processes that exist. The soccer association also provides training/support to new directors as well as other community soccer directors can provide assistance.

Halloween Safety

Alberta Health Services EMS would like to remind parents and trick-or-treaters of some Halloween safety tips as October 31st approaches. Take some time to review these simple tips and reminders to help ensure your Halloween is a fun and safe night for everyone.

Trick-or-Treaters

- Remember: all regular pedestrian rules still apply. Be sure to cross the road at marked crosswalks, or well-lit corners only. It is safest to work your way up one side of the street, and then cross once to the other side.
- Stay away from houses that are not well lit. Do not accept rides from strangers, or enter any home you feel is unsafe.
- Let your parents know where you are going to be at all times (route) and advise them if you will be late returning.

Parents

- Be certain that young trick-or-treaters are accompanied by an adult. Older children should stay in groups.
- Pre-determine boundaries to trick-or-treat within, and establish a firm time to return home.
- Advise children not to eat anything until they return home. Dispose of any items that appear to have been tampered with, or that are not properly wrapped.

Costumes

- Choose bright colored costumes that are highly visible. Adding reflective tape to costumes further increases visibility.
- Consider sending your children with a flashlight for additional safety and increased visibility.
- When purchasing, or making costumes, look for materials and accessories that are labeled flame-resistant.
- All costume accessories, such as sticks, rods, or wands, should be soft and flexible, with no sharp edges.
- Consider using hypoallergenic make-up kits instead of masks that may impair breathing, or vision.
- Be sure costumes are loose enough to be worn over warm clothing, but not so long that they become a tripping hazard. Costumes should not be longer than your child's ankles.
- Ensure your child is wearing adequate foot wear that takes into consideration weather conditions and walking.
